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# **CLASS DISCUSSION - What animal remains can tell us.**

# **Debate Title: Archaeology for the Future**

Archaeology helps us understand our future. Without it we would have difficulty understanding today's world and how times have changed. We would not understand how objects were made, important events that occurred or a chronology of our past. However, archaeologists often come under criticism. Rescue archaeology can take time as archaeologists need to excavate carefully and slowly. When archaeological sites are discovered, it can cause delays to the construction of important buildings and add to the cost of projects.
